PROPOSALS TO BE SUBMITTED TO ELECTORS

Hanover Township

Proposition A

Shall the expired previously voted increase in the tax limitation imposed under Article IX, Sec. 6 of the Michigan Constitution in Hanover Township, of 1 mill (\$1.00 per \$1,000 of taxable value) reduced to .8377 mill (\$.84 per \$1,000 of taxable value) by the required millage rollbacks, be renewed at and increased up to the original voted 1 mill (\$1.00 per \$1,000 of taxable value) and levied for 10 years, 2009 through 2018 inclusive, in order to provide for the continued maintenance and operation of the Township Fire Department, the purchase of fire extinguishing apparatus, equipment, and housing of such equipment and apparatus raising an estimated \$118, 287.00 in the first year the millage is levied?

Springport Township

Proposal

Shall the 15 mill tax limitation on general ad valorem taxes within Springport Township imposed under Article IX, Section 6 of the Michigan Constitution be increased for said Township, Jackson County, Michigan by 1.5 mills (\$1.50 per \$1,000.00 of taxable value) for a period of four (4) years, 2009 through 2012 for fire and rescue operations; and shall the Township levy such increase in the millage for such purpose, thereby raising in the first year an estimated \$72,592.00?

Columbia School District

PROPOSITION A

OPERATING MILLAGE PROPOSAL, NON-HOMESTEAD & NON-QUALIFIED AGRICULTURAL PROPERTY TAX

If passed, this Proposition A will allow the School District to levy not more than the statutory rate of 18 mills against non-homestead and non-qualified agricultural property required for the School District to receive its revenue per pupil foundation guarantee.

Shall the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property, excepting homestead and qualified agricultural property in Columbia School District, Jackson, Lenawee, Washtenaw and Hillsdale Counties, Michigan, be increased by three (3) mills (\$3.00 on each \$1,000.00 of taxable valuation) for a period of 5 years, 2009 to 2013, inclusive, to provide funds for operating purposes, such increase being a renewal of three (3) mills which expired with the 2008 tax levy (the estimated amount of revenue that will be collected in calendar year 2009 if said three (3) mills is authorized and levied is \$672,728 all of which will be disbursed to Columbia School District)?

Concord Community Schools

PROPOSITION A

OPERATING MILLAGE PROPOSAL, NON-HOMESTEAD & NON-QUALIFIED AGRICULTURAL PROPERTY TAX

If passed, this Proposition A will allow the School District to levy not more than the statutory rate of 18 mills against non-homestead and non-qualified agricultural property required for the School District to receive its revenue per pupil foundation guarantee.

Shall the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property, excepting homestead and qualified agricultural property in Concord Community Schools, Jackson County, Michigan, be increased by five (5) mills (\$5.00 on each \$1,000.00 of taxable valuation) for a period of 3 years, 2009 to 2011, inclusive, to provide funds for operating purposes, such increase being a renewal of five (5) mills which expired with the 2008 tax levy (the estimated amount of revenue that will be collected in calendar year 2009 if said five (5) mills is authorized and levied is \$75,421.00 all of which will be disbursed to Concord Community Schools)?

East Jackson Community Schools

BONDING PROPOSAL

Shall East Jackson Community Schools, Jackson County, Michigan, borrow the sum of not to exceed Nine Hundred Ninety-Five Thousand Dollars (\$995,000) and issue its general obligation unlimited tax bonds therefor, for purposes of:

partially remodeling school buildings; acquiring and installing educational technology improvements; and purchasing and equipping school buses?

The following is for informational purposes only:

The estimated millage that will be levied for the proposed bonds in 2009, under current law, is .18 mill (\$0.18 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation). The maximum number of years the bonds may be outstanding, exclusive of any refunding, is twelve (12) years. The estimated simple average annual millage anticipated to be required to retire this bond debt is .42 mill (\$0.42 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation).

If the school district borrows from the State to pay debt service on the bonds, the school district may be required to continue to levy mills beyond the term of the bonds to repay the State.

(Pursuant to State law, expenditure of bond proceeds must be audited, and the proceeds cannot be used for repair or maintenance costs, teacher, administrator or employee salaries, or other operating expenses.)

Michigan Center School District

PROPOSITION A

MILLAGE PROPOSAL, BUILDING AND SITE SINKING FUND TAX LEVY

Shall the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property, in Michigan Center School District, Jackson County, Michigan, be increased by and the Board of Education be authorized to levy, not to exceed 3 mills (\$3.00 on each \$1,000.00 of taxable valuation) for a period of 6 years, 2009 to 2014, inclusive, to create a sinking fund for the purchase of real estate for sites for, and the construction or repair of school buildings and all other purposes authorized by law; such increase being a renewal of three (3) mills which expired with the 2008 tax levy (the estimate of the revenue the school district will collect if the millage is approved and levied in 2009 is approximately \$608,500.00)?

Chelsea School District

BONDING PROPOSAL

Shall Chelsea School District, Washtenaw and Jackson Counties, Michigan, borrow the sum of not to exceed Eighteen Million Seven Hundred Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$18,720,000) and issue its general obligation unlimited tax bonds there for, in one or more series, for the purpose of: erecting, furnishing and equipping additions to and partially remodeling, furnishing and refurnishing,

equipping and re-equipping school facilities; acquiring, installing and equipping educational technology for school facilities; purchasing school buses; constructing, equipping, developing and improving physical education/athletic facilities, play fields, and playgrounds; erecting storage buildings; and developing and improving sites?
